1. What Easy English Conversation does

Easy English Conversation (EEC) is designed primarily to help you improve spoken English by practising realistic conversations aloud. Instead of only reading vocabulary or grammar, you choose a conversation, listen to it, practise speaking it, test yourself and review your progress.

Screenshots in this guide are examples from Easy English Conversation. Minor wording or layout may vary as the service is improved.

English is the main and default learning focus. EEC can also be used to practise other languages. That is an additional feature; it does not change the main purpose of the service.

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You can use ready-made conversations or create your own. Teachers can organise conversations into conversation groups, share them with students using an access code, approve join requests and review progress.

Who is it for?

- Learners who want practical speaking practice for everyday life, travel, study or work.
- Teachers who want to give students speaking activities and review their progress.
- Guests who want to try EEC before creating a free account.

The two language settings

Setting	What it means
Website language	The language used for menus, buttons and instructions.
Language I'm learning	The language you listen to, practise and test.
Tip: On desktop, the website-language control appears as the language chip, such as English. On mobile, the menu also shows the words Website language.	

2. Learner guide

Start from the homepage

Choose Improve my English to enter the learner journey.

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Test my English level

If you are unsure of your level, choose Test my English level. EEC uses CEFR levels A1 to C2. Choose the level you think is closest to your English now. If you are unsure, that is fine - the test helps you check your starting point.

- A1 - Breakthrough
- A2 - Elementary
- B1 - Intermediate
- B2 - Upper intermediate
- C1 - Advanced
- C2 - Mastery

EEC provides CEFR-aligned speaking practice. It does not issue an official CEFR certificate.

Choose a conversation

1. Check Language I'm learning. After you have selected a language, EEC shows the current language with a Change control.
2. Choose the level you want to practise.
3. Choose a Conversation group.
4. Choose the conversation you want to use.

Conversation groups keep related conversations together. For example, a Travel group might contain Airport, Hotel, Restaurant and Asking for Directions.

Tip: If you change Language I'm learning to Thai or another language, the website can remain in English. The two settings are independent.

Listen

Listen lets you hear the conversation before you speak it. Choose Listen and then Start listening. Use this stage to become familiar with the speakers, vocabulary, pronunciation and rhythm.

Practise

Practise is where you speak the conversation yourself and receive help. Choose Practise and then Start practising. Work through the conversation one line at a time.

Example: pronunciation help for individual words during Practice.

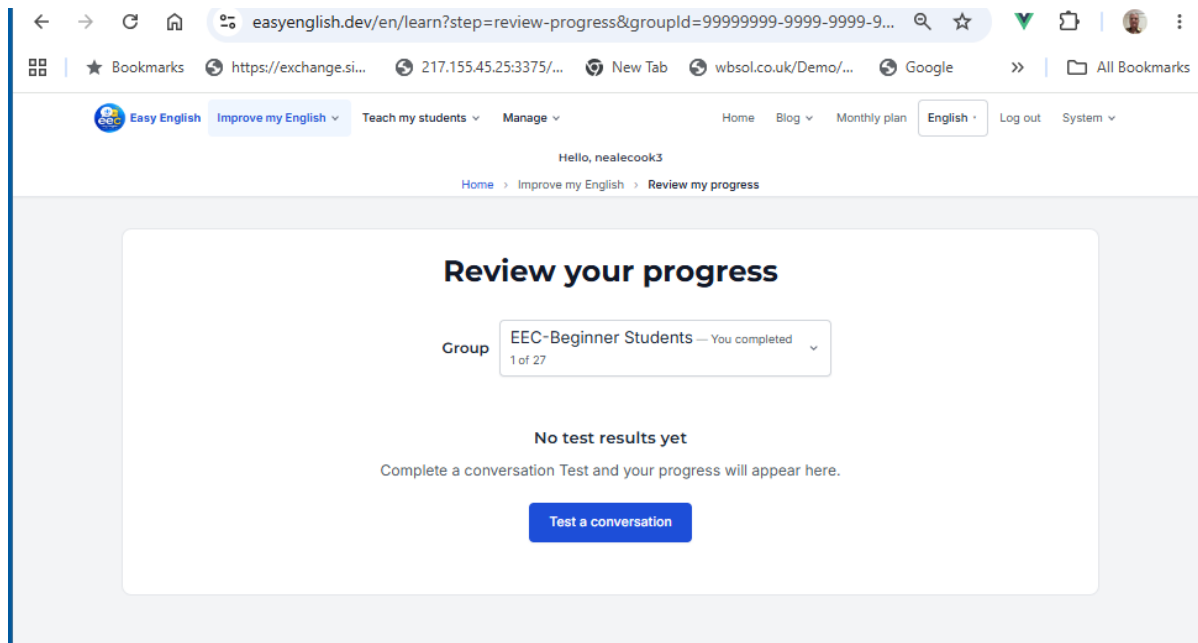
- Use Help when you need pronunciation support.
- Use Repeat when you want to practise the whole sentence again.
- After a practice result, Practise these words lets you focus on individual difficult words.
- For an individual word you can listen, see How to say it, view a meaning when available, practise the word, check accuracy, try again or move to the next word.

Tip: Practising one difficult word does not replace sentence practice. Return to the full sentence when you are ready.

Test

Test lets you try the conversation with less help. Choose Test and then Start test. The purpose is to check how well you can speak the conversation after listening and practising.

Review your progress



Example: Review your progress screen before a test result has been saved.

Use Review my progress to see saved results and improvement. Depending on the screen, EEC may use Review my progress as the link or breadcrumb and Review your progress as the page heading.

Create my own conversation

Use Create when you want to practise a situation that is useful to you.

1. Enter a Conversation title describing what you want to practise.
2. Choose Create it for me if you want EEC to generate the conversation from your topic.
3. Choose Type it myself if you want to write the conversation yourself.

The screen explains: Tell EEC what you want to practise and we'll create a conversation for you.

After creating or modifying a conversation, use the normal learner actions: Listen, Practise, Test or Select another conversation.

Join a teacher's conversation group

Example: enter the access code supplied by your teacher and request to join.

If your teacher gives you an access code, choose Join a conversation group. Enter the code and send the request. Your teacher can then accept or approve your request. Once approved, the shared conversation group becomes available to you.

Create a free account

You can begin as a Guest. Creating a free account lets you keep your conversations, progress and groups. The account screens use Create a free account, Sign in / Sign in to my account, and Forgot your password? -> Reset your password.

Tip: If you are already working as a guest, use Create a free account when you want to keep that work with your account.

3. Teacher guide

Choose Teach my students from the homepage. EEC's teacher workflow is built around creating conversations, putting them into conversation groups, sharing them with students and reviewing progress.

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Create a conversation

The teacher Create screen uses the same simple title-first approach as the learner screen. Enter a title, then choose Create it for me or Type it myself.

Use conversation groups

A Conversation group is the named object that holds related conversations and can be shared with students. You can think of your students informally as a class, but the item you share in EEC is the conversation group.

Share with students

1. Open Share a conversation group with your students.
2. Choose the conversation group you want to share.
3. Give students the access code.
4. Students use Join a conversation group and request access.
5. Open the teacher request/approval area and Accept or approve the students.

The interactive teacher walkthrough demonstrates this sequence using the example group Your Special Class A2.

Review progress

Use the teacher progress area to review how the group and individual students are doing. EEC uses screen-specific labels such as Review progress and Review my students' progress. When writing instructions or helping a student, follow the label shown on the current screen.

Print or save reports

Group and individual progress reports use the browser's normal print function. Choose the report's Print option, then print it or select Save as PDF in the browser print dialog. After printing or cancelling, the same report remains open.

Interactive walkthrough

The teacher homepage includes Watch an interactive walkthrough. It demonstrates Create -> Share -> Students join -> Accept/approve -> Review progress. The Create step shows the same title-first Create it for me / Type it myself screen as the real application. The walkthrough is a demonstration: its Create buttons do not generate a real conversation.

4. Accounts, language and common questions

Guest, free account and sign in

Term	Meaning
Guest	You are trying EEC without a permanent signed-in account.
Create a free account	Keep your conversations, progress and groups.
Sign in	Open an account you already created.

Change the language you practise

On the conversation-selection screen, use Change next to Language I'm learning. Changing this does not have to change the Website language.

Microphone and audio

- Allow microphone access when your browser asks for it during speaking practice.
- If EEC cannot hear you, check that the correct microphone is selected in your browser or computer settings.
- If you cannot hear playback, check your device volume and browser audio permissions.
- If a speaking result is still being checked, wait for the result before starting another action.

Password reset

From Sign in, choose Forgot your password?, then use Reset your password and Send password reset link.

6. Notes about labels in EEC

Some labels deliberately vary by screen. For example, the journey may say Test while the activity page says Test the conversation; a link may say Review my progress while the page heading says Review your progress; and teacher screens may use Accept or Approve students. This guide follows the wording used on the relevant production screen rather than forcing one label everywhere.

7. Getting help

If you are unsure what to do next, return to the homepage and choose Improve my English or Teach my students. Teachers can also use Watch an interactive walkthrough for a guided demonstration of the main teacher workflow.
